Dear Parents,

Our checks on the coloured sand used in the hall have come back. Two samples have returned a positive result for asbestos.

The hall will be professionally cleaned by a Class A licensed asbestos removal company and will remain closed and not used by anyone until this takes place. The hall will reopen once this process is complete and verified as safe.

We have also found, in another room, coloured sand that had been left over from 2024 in the cupboard. This will also be tested and, as a precaution, students from any rooms that are possibly affected will be relocated until the test results come back.

We want to assure you that we are handling this situation with the utmost seriousness and urgency. This asbestos contamination is connected to a wider product recall across New Zealand and Australia. If you have purchased or used similar coloured sand or 'magic sand' products at home, we urge you to check them immediately.

We are following Ministry of Education guidelines. We are also working closely with an asbestos consultant team and a Class A licensed asbestos removal company. Their preliminary risk assessment is:

• Low risk of airborne exposure: the risk of exposure to airborne asbestos fibres is considered low. This is primarily because the material is bound together with glue, is gluggy/heavy and is unlikely to become airborne.

Worksafe NZ have been notified of the upcoming remedial work to be carried out in the hall.

We appreciate your understanding and support as we manage this situation with the utmost care, and we will continue to keep you informed.

Important Reminder for Families Arriving/Departing by Car

As we approach "the silly season," tempers can fray and patience may run thin. Let's all remember to show consideration, courtesy, and care in our road behaviour to keep our children and community safe.

Please follow the road rules:

- Do not park and leave your car in the P2 drop-off area at the front of the school.
- Do not stop on dotted yellow lines to drop off children.
- Do not stop in the bus stop or mobility park double-parking is dangerous.

Drive safely around the school:

- Avoid 3-point turns into driveways or footpaths where children walk.
- · Keep your speed low at all times.
