I witness and receive numerous complaints around drivers making U-turns right outside the school, parking in driveways, double parking on the main road (i.e. inside the white lines) and parking on yellow dotted lines. Students get out of, or hop into, stationary cars stopped in the middle of the road.

Most of our parents are considerate and careful on the roads around the school. Unfortunately, those who are running late, frustrated about the lack of parking and taking short cuts, put all of our students at risk.

All drivers are asked to obey road rules and drive considerately near the school.

Parents and students are asked to use the designated crossings please, especially when with a child.

When local street speed limits are reversed, they will be replaced by a new variable speed limit sign on the road outside the school gates for 300 metres. Variable speed limit signs lower the speed limit to 30 km per hour and will operate at the start and end of the school day.
